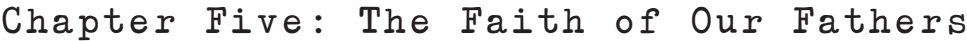

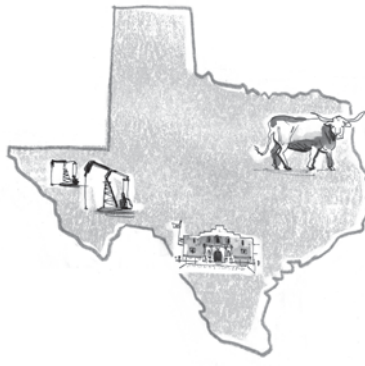


Chapter Six: A Spoon in My Tea

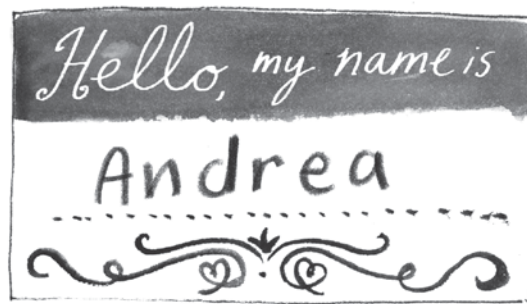


Chapter Seven: The Road More Traveled
